



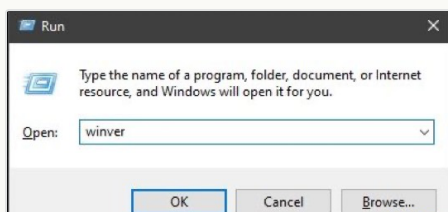
Set up the secure browser on your Windows PC

Your student will log into a **secure browser** for the required ILEARN Checkpoint in October. Check your PC and install it now, so test day starts smoothly.

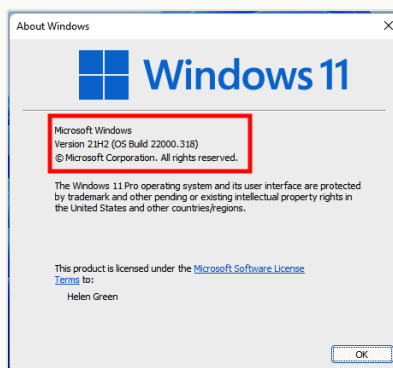
We don't recommend Chromebooks. They aren't compatible with the secure browser's device requirements unless a school system has specifically set them up and manages them.

1 Check which version of Windows you have

1. Hold down the **Windows key** and press **R**.
2. In the box that appears, type **winver** (short for "Windows version"), then click **OK**.
3. An **About Windows** box will open. Your version is listed a few lines down.



Type **winver** here, then click **OK**.



The version sits in the middle of the box.

You're set

Windows 11, version **24H2** or higher.

Update first

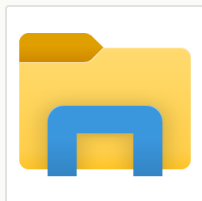
A version lower than 24H2, or anything older than Windows 11. Check your device for available updates, then look again.

2 Check that you have 20 GB or more of free space

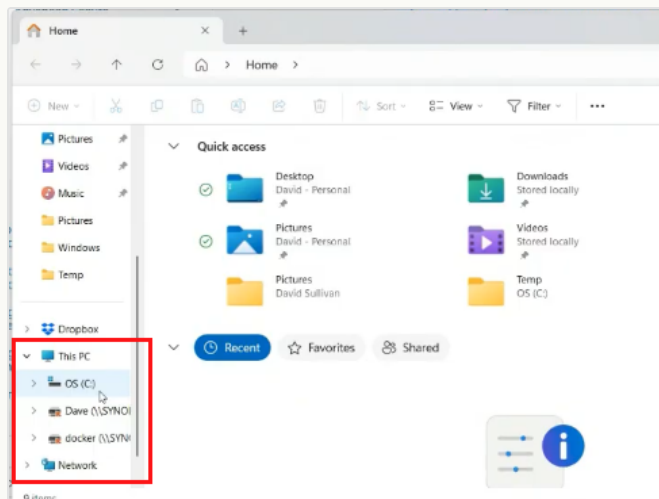
1. On the taskbar at the bottom of your screen, click the folder-shaped **File Explorer** icon.
2. In the panel on the left, find **This PC**. Below that, find the option that contains the characters **(C:)**.

3. Right-click **(C:)**, then choose **Properties**.

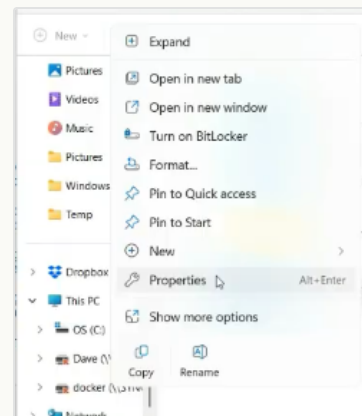
4. Read the **Free space** line.



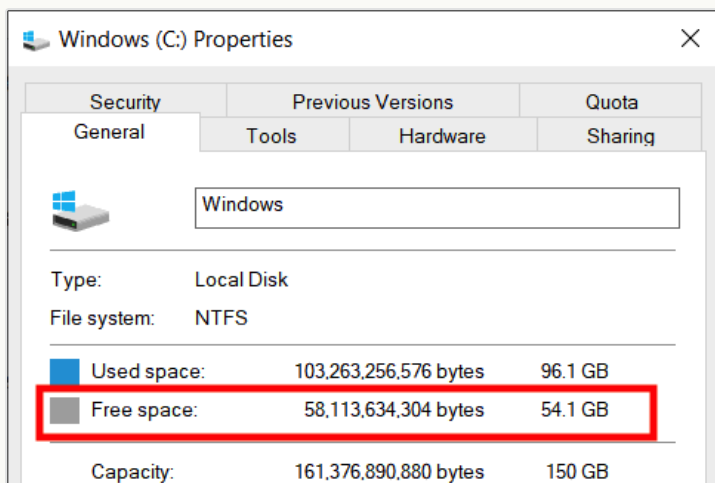
File Explorer, on the taskbar.

20 GB or more of free space.

Clear some room

Less than 20 GB. Delete files you no longer need, then check again.

Download the secure browser

1. Go to the [Indiana secure browser page](#), then click the **Windows** tab on the left side of the screen.
2. Click **Download Secure Browser**.
3. Open your **Downloads** folder and click the file you just downloaded.
4. Follow the prompts in the installer window until it finishes.

That's everything. Leave the browser installed — your student will use it on Checkpoint day.
